United States Senator to Speak at Medical Conference Sunday in Portland

PORTLAND, OR; Jun 20, 2014 – The American Society of Echocardiography (ASE), the largest global organization for cardiovascular ultrasound imaging, is honored to announce that Senator Ron Wyden, the senior United States Senator for Oregon, will be addressing attendees of its <u>Silver Anniversary Scientific</u> <u>Sessions</u> on **Sunday, June 22nd at 9:00 am** in the Portland Ballroom of the Oregon Convention Center.

Senator Wyden is one of the most influential legislators in Washington, serving as Chair of the Senate Finance Committee, arguably the chamber's most powerful committee, with jurisdiction over a myriad of issues including pensions, trade and **healthcare**.

This presentation will be held following the Edler Lecture during the Society's annual business meeting and awards event.
