

# The RUC: Physicians and Health Care Professionals Ensuring Fair Valuation of Medical Services

#### What is the RUC?

The American Medical Association (AMA)/
Specialty Society RVS Update Committee (RUC) is a group of volunteer physicians and other health care professionals that provides the federal government with recommendations on the resources needed for medical procedures and services.

These recommendations are informed by input from thousands of health care professionals, and they help ensure patient access to medical innovation by incorporating real-world, front-line perspectives into payment decisions.





### What is the AMA's role?

The **AMA** created the RUC in 1991 to share clinical expertise and ensure medical services are appropriately valued. As a **neutral convener**, the AMA listens, encourages participation, and includes diverse perspectives in the decision-making process.



# Who makes up the RUC?

- · 32 volunteer members
- · 300 advisors
- Representing 100+ specialties and health care professions
- Input from 100,000+ surveyed physicians and other health care professionals annually



## How does the RUC work?

Using their first-hand experience in patient care, the RUC evaluates the resources needed for medical procedures and services. Recommendations are based on data from practicing clinicians about:

- · Time, intensity (effort, skill, and stress) required
- Practice cost inputs (i.e., clinical staff, medical supplies, and equipment)

#### How are RUC recommendations used?

The RUC provides its expertise at no cost to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS).



CMS considers RUC <u>recommendations</u>, along with other data, to develop relative values for medical services.



These values are subject to rulemaking and public comment before implementation.
